

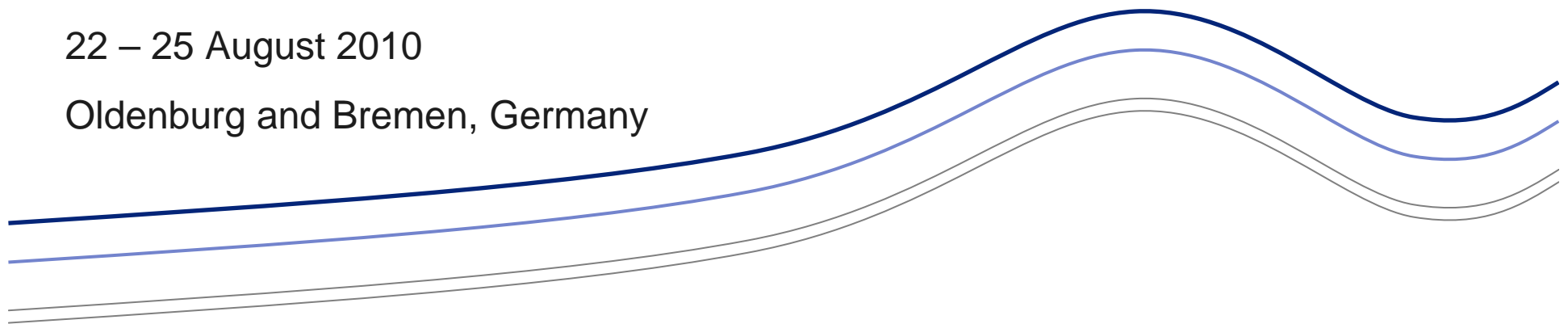

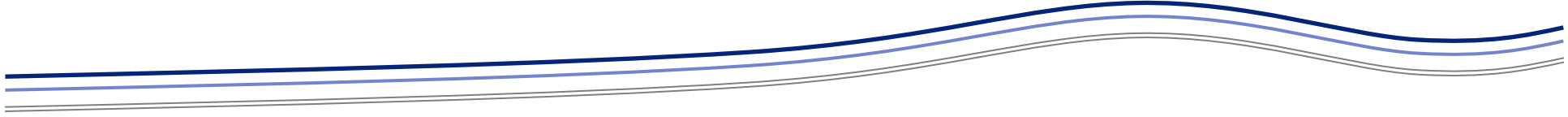
How to get
involved?

- Call for Papers to be released within the next weeks
- Parallel session submissions:
 - *full paper* (15 minutes presentation with session discussant)
 - *short presentations* (5 minutes presentation with break out discussions)
 - *special sessions* on the basis of full papers (90 minutes in total with 15 minutes presentations and session discussant)
- abstract submission of max. 400 words
- deadline: **30 November 2009**
- full paper submission by **1 July 2010**
- online abstract submission system



Where?

- Oldenburg and Bremen are two adjacent cities in north-western Germany
- nearby UNESCO World Heritage Site “Wadden Sea”
- both universities have a strong record in ecological economic research and teaching
- scientific sessions to be held on the premises of Oldenburg University
- conference dinner and reception to be held in the historic Town hall in Bremen
- international airport Bremen, excellent high speed train connections
- accommodation in Bremen and Oldenburg
- train connections and shuttle services between Oldenburg and Bremen
